flags, slow deterioration will eventually come into play. When this occurs, people are taught how to discard an American flag in an orderly and respectful manner.

<u>Intensifying La Niña hints at active hurricane</u> <u>season ahead</u> <u>TAMPA (WFLA)</u> — Over the past few weeks, La Niña has grown stronger. This is concerning because La Niña's typically correspond with active hurricane seasons in the Atlantic Ocean.

The La Niña effect of weaker upper-level wind shear and more Atlantic activity can be intensified by warmer Atlantic Ocean waters. That is present right now and it will likely continue into summer.

Hurricane season is still more than two months away and a lot can change between now and then, but if past seasons are any indication, we should be prepared for an active summer ahead in the Atlantic Basin.

WHAT TO PACK IN YOUR HURRICANE SURVIVAL KIT

Bottled Water. According to Ready.gov, every kit should include one gallon of water per person, per day, for at least three days.

Non-Perishable food. You need at least a three-day food supply, per person and per pet.

Old-School Radio. Each kit should include a batterypowered radio (with extra batteries) or a hand-crank radio. The radio will keep you updated on storm conditions and rescue efforts.

First-Aid Kit. A deluxe first aid kit that includes more than bandages and rubbing alcohol is key.

Bathroom Essentials. Even during a natural disaster you'll have to use the bathroom. Have extra garbage bags, toilet paper, wet wipes, and hand sanitizer for everyone.

The nearest public shelter if we were to be evacuated is at Alta Vista Elementary School on 544 east of HWY 27, 1½ miles on the left going into Haines City. JUST AS A REMINDER: The clubhouse is not a dedicated hurricane shelter. Although if you feel safer there than in your manufactured home, you may certainly go there.

Try This: While sitting in a chair, lift your right foot off the floor and make clockwise circles. While doing this, draw the number 6 in the air with your right hand. Your foot will automatically change direction.
