One of the most abundant birds in North America and wildly loved, are the Northern Cardinals. Despite their name, they actually originated in the south and have now migrated as far north as southeastern Canada. They also can be found throughout the eastern and central United States. Cardinals are the state bird for 7 U.S. states. They are year-round residents wherever they live as they do not migrate.

The males are a beautiful crimson red all over and the females are a pale brown with reddish tinges on the wings, tail, and crest. Both have a black face with a bright orange/red beak.

Northern Cardinals are also associated with a great deal of folklore, legends, and spiritual beliefs in many different cultures. It is common folklore that a visit from a cardinal represents a sign from a loved one who has passed. I like to believe that's true.
